

RLAPP Website Policy

Brief context

The RLA was Incorporated as a limited company on May 1st 2013, the Rushcliffe Learning Alliance (RLA) is a group of 31 primary south Nottinghamshire schools who have committed to work together. The RLA is a vehicle to combine our respective expertise for the purpose of supporting collaboration and exploiting opportunities between us to deliver school improvement and to capture “best practice”.

The schools acknowledge that collaboration and partnership are embedded in the school system. We therefore intend to build on our already close ties to raise standards across the schools and improve achievement levels for the benefit of over 5000 children in our communities.

Our schools are committed to the advancement of inclusive high quality and sustainable education and lifelong learning for children and young people.

Pupil Privacy & Safety

The Rushcliffe Learning Alliance operates the following policy on its pupil parliament website regarding the use of photographs, to ensure the privacy and safety of pupils across all the RLA schools:

- Only the RLAPP home page is accessible to the general public – all the other links from the home page require a unique username and password to gain access. These are provided directly to the individual RLA schools to use. They are changed each term and the individual school staff, manage the administration of these unique log in details.
- Where a photograph is used which shows a pupil, no name is displayed
- When clips of the parliament in action are recorded only the school names are referenced on any piece of audio. (All video clips will only be accessible by the RLA schools using their unique log in details)

When choosing photographs/video clips for the website, the RLA is mindful of the way pupils may appear in them, and will not include images which are in any way inappropriate.

Each individual RLA school follows a policy of seeking parents' permission before using images which show pupils on the website.

No other private information about pupils is ever published on the website such as surnames or contact details.

Website Privacy Policy

We are committed to safeguarding the privacy of our website visitors; this policy sets out how we will treat your personal information.

(1) What information do we collect?

We may collect, store and use the following kinds of personal data:

1. Information about your visits to and use of this website;
2. Information about any transactions carried out between you and us on or in relation to this website;
3. Information that you provide to us for the purpose of registering with us, and/or leaving forum comments, and/or subscribing to our website services and/or email notifications.

(2) Information about website visits
